Recount Stories and Determine Moral

Standard Description

Recount stories, including fables, folktales, and myths from diverse cultures; determine the central message, lesson, or moral and explain how it is conveyed through key details in the text.

Lesson Objectives

- 1. Identify and summarize the key elements of fables, folktales, and myths.
- 2. Analyze the central message, lesson, or moral of the text.
- 3. Explain how details in the text convey its message.

Activities

- 1. Read a fable or folktale from the provided passage.
- 2. Group activity: Summarize the story and identify the central message.
- 3. Worksheet: Analyze the story's key details and write your own folktale.

Reading Passage
